

DUTIES OF THE JUSTIFIED: Definition: That which a person is bound by moral obligation to do, or refrain from doing.
(Duty)

1. Duty to God:

- 1. Must consecrate ourselves. Romans 12:1
- 2. Cannot be conformed to the world. Rom. 12:2

2. Duty to ourselves:

- 1. Not to be conceited. Rom. 12:3

3. Duty to the church of our Lord.

- 1 Use our gifts in the right way. Rom. 12:4-8

4. Our duty to other Christians. Rom.12:9-13

- 1. We are to love other Christians. 1 Pet.1:22
- 2. Love is shown in various ways. Rom. 12:9-13.

5. Duty to our enemy.

- 1. We are not avenge. Romans.12:14-21.
- 2. Love, your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you and persecute you. Matthew 5:44.

6. Our duty to the state:

- 1. Be subject to the powers that be. Rom.13:1-7

NOTE:

- 1. The Christians at that early age were usually associated with the Jews, and the Jews were noted for turbulence.
- 2. There was danger that Christians under persecution would be inclined to make disturbance.

7. Our Duty to our neighbors:

- 1. Owe no man anything. Romans 13:8-14

8. Our duty to a weak brother. Rom.14:1; 15:1.

9. Our duty to all: Observe courtesies. 1Pet.3:8
Romans 16:1-4
