

GOD'S WILL AND MAN'S SALVATION. 1Tim.2:1-4
Titus 2:11; 2Pet. 3:9

NOTE: Some teach that God's will is irresistible; that what he wills to come to pass, invariably comes to pass.

1. God will have all men be saved. 1Pet. 3:9.
Note: If God's will invariably comes to pass, then all men will be saved.

2. When the thing that God wills depends solely upon his action, it invariably comes to pass.

a. God said, Let there be light, Gen. 1:3,
There was light. This depended altogether on God's action... Man was not involved.

b. God said, Let us make man in our image.
Gen. 1:26. This depended on God's action and it came to pass

C. Rain to Come. Gen. 6:17; 7:4-11

3. When the execution of God's will is dependent upon man's will it does not invariably come to pass.

a. God willed man's happiness in Eden but man rejected it. Gen. 3:1-21.

b. Noah and his family carried out God's will and were saved. Those who rejected God's will were lost. Gen. 6, 7.

c. God willed the destruction of Ninevah, It did not come to pass, they repented.

d. God wills our salvation, but we must obey. *Phil 2:8*
