- 3.3. He measured himself by his conscience (his disposition) toward justice and equity in all of his proceedings.
 1. I PUT ON RIGHTEOUSNESS AND IT CLOTHED ME. My desire was always to do right in all of my proceedings.
 2. THE CAUSE WHICH I KNEW NOT I SEARCHED OUT. He never answered a matter before he heard it.

 1. HE BROKE THE JAWS OF THE WICKED. How did he brake their jaws or neck
