WHAT MOSES SHOULD SAY TO THE ELDERS. Exo.3:16.15

Two things promised:

1. That they should be brought forth out of the affliction of Egypt.
2. That they should be established in a good land, "a land flowing with milk and honey."

MOSES' TWO OBJECTIONS

1. The unbelief of the people, "they will not believe me nor hearken to my voice."
Exodus 4:1
2. Moses' lack of eloquence, "I am not eloquent, neither heretofore, nor since thou hast spoken unto thy servant: but I am slow of speech, and of a slow tongue!"
Exodus 4:10

MOSES AND AARON BEFORE THE PEOPLE. Exo.4:29-31

1. Aaron preached. His sermon:

- A. All the words which the Lord had spoken unto Moses. Exodus 4:30.
- B. He did the signs before the elders of Israel. Exodus 4:2-9; 4:30.

WHEN THE ISRAELITES HEARD THE WORD OF GOD

1. What did they hear? They heard:

- A. That the Lord had visited the children of Israel. (Exodus 4:31)
- B. That he looked upon their affliction.

2. When they heard...What did they do?

- A. They believed. Exo.4:31, Heb. 11:6
- B. They bowed their heads..Gratitude.
- C. They worshipped God. Submission and Obedience.
