THANKSGIVING

1. At the last Supper Jesus spoke a blessing as he gave thanks: Mark 14:22; Matthew 26:27.

COMMUNION

1. An act of fellowship with one another and the Lord Jesus. We meet:
 1. Around his table. It is "His Table" 1 Cor. 10:21. It is "His Supper" 1 Cor. 11:20.
 2. We received the spiritual blessings of his blood and his body; 1 Cor. 10:16.

COMMEMORATION

1. The Lord's Supper is a memorial, portraying his death; his self-giving. "This do in remembrance of me." 1 Cor. 11:24-26
2. A Pouring out of his blood; not a "spilling" of his blood.

ANTICIPATION

1. The Lord's Supper brings the future before us in a special way.
 1. There is an expectation of the Lord's return. 1 Cor. 11:26

SACRIFICE

1. Christ made a once-for-all sacrifice Heb. 10:12.
 1. His church is a living continuation of that sacrifice. The Lord's Supper, as all worship, is an act of sacrifice, of praise and confession. Heb. 13:15
