

1. THE BURNING BUSH: The second miracle of the Old Bible.
 - (1) The fire not kindled by any natural source

2. THE MIRACULOUS MANIFESTATION WAS TIMELY. ⁽¹⁾ In relation to the people for whom it was made.
 - (1) The 400 years of affliction had passed away. Genesis 15:13.
 - (2) In relation to the man to whom it was made, The life of Moses was divided into three forties:
 1. The completion of the first forty years brought him to Midian. Acts 7:23
 2. At the end of the second forty years he was brought back to Egypt. Acts 7:30
 3. The third forty: Died and was buried in a valley in Moab. Deut. 34:5-7.

3. THE MIRACLE ATTAINED THE END FOR WHICH IT WAS INTENDED:
 - (1) It arrested attention and led to inquiry. Matt. 7:7, 8; James 1:5-8; 1 John 5:14, 15
 - (2) Right inquiry leads to increased knowledge of God. 1 Tim. 2:4; Col. 1:10; 2 Pet. 1:5.
 - (3) Increased knowledge leads to deeper reverence. Exodus 3:6; Hebrews 12:9, 28, 29.

4. IN ORDER TO SEE THIS GREAT SIGHT: THE BURNING BUSH, WE MUST, LIKE MOSES, TURN ASIDE. Exo. 3:3
 - (1) We must turn aside from the world. 1 John 2:15; Rom. 12:2; 2 Cor. 6:17, 18; Revelation 18:4.
 - (2) We must turn aside from carnality. John 3:1-9; 1 Cor. 2:14; 3:1-3. of the body of flesh - cast of appetites
 - (3) We must turn aside from sin. What is sin? 1 John 3:4; 5:17; 1 Cor. 15:33, 34; 2 John 9; Sins must be blotted out. Acts 2:38; 3:19; 22:16.
