3-He must have known of the work of God in Nebuchadnezzar's Day:

- 1-The delivery of the three Hebrews from the fire just 23 years past.
- 2-Just 13 years since the insanity and recovery of king Nebuchadnezzar.

2-In the road down: Steps may ^{be} different with different sinners; but there is a gradual descent with all, though it must be admitted that on "that night" some were taken by the king at lightning speed.

1-The king ignored all the circumstances of his position.

- 1-This was indeed terrible.
- 2-For long the Persian lines of battle had been drawn round the city.
- 3-Engineers had been turning the river from its bed.
- 4-At this hour things were becoming critical.
- 5-Facts are stubborn things which even a heathen might note.

2-The king sacrificed his own dignity:

- 1-He sacrificed his dignity as king.
- 2-He sacrificed his dignity as a man.
- 3-It was not usual for Babylonian kings to make themselves the boon companion of their subjects.

4-We owe respect to man, as made in the image of God, rational man, moral man, immortal man; but not the less to ourselves

3-STEP NUMBER THREE: The king plunged into drunkenness.

1-The lightning steps of the king in his downward rush to destruction may be directly attributed to his drunken condition.

2-Alcohol is the tap root of many vices

4-In a drunken stupor the king jested with things sacred.

1-To jest with things sacred, and in the language of the Bible, is a "sure mark of a fool" Luke 12:20: Thou fool this night thy soul shall be required of thee.

5-He violated the decencies of domestic life:

1-Bringing the harem into the banquet-chamber was a gross offence against even the Oriental idea.

6-At last he openly insulted God:

1-He drank wine out of the Sacred vessels of God, and that, unto other gods.
