EXPLANATIONS

This Testament is marked on every subject connected with the theme of SALVATION. Every important verse on each subject is underlined. Other verses not so important have simply a perpendicular line drawn on margin.

A reference to the first verse on each subject is printed after the subject in the index (see preceding page). After every verse or passage marked in this Testament there is a reference to the next verse or passage on the same subject. This will enable any one to give a Bible reading, at a moment's notice, on any subject marked in the Testament. When the reference is to another chapter or verse in the same book of the Bible, only the number of the chapter and verse, without the name of the book, is given; thus, the reference "4. 16" which occurs at the close of Matt. 1. 21 means that Matthew fourth chapter and sixteenth verse is the next passage on the same subject.

The capital letters used in the index and on the margin of verses, and in front of the references, are used to indicate the subject; thus F stands for FAITH, R for REPENTANCE, etc. (see preceding page). The letters on the margin of a verse will enable the person who is familiar with them to tell at a glance the subjects of the verse or passage. Any one can rapidly turn to verses on any subject by watching for the proper letter on the margin. The page preceding this one shows the subject for which each letter stands. The letter in front of each reference indicates the subject to which the reference belongs and enables the reader to select the proper reference when a number of references on different subjects are given.
